The James W. Buie Scholarship

James W. Buie joined the Gaston County Police Department in 1987, after graduating from Belmont Abbey College with a degree in Political Science. During his 30 year law enforcement career Buie served in every unit and function within the department. His leadership abilities and strong work ethic allowed him to rise through the ranks to become Chief of Police in 2011. Chief Buie was the first African-American Police Chief in Gaston County History.

This full tuition scholarship, valued at \$74,000 to be paid evenly over four years in partnership with Belmont Abbey College, has been created to strengthen local ties between Gaston County and the College, and increase the diversity of GCPD. Successful scholars will earn a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice from Belmont Abbey College, and secure employment with Gaston County Police Department upon graduation.

Applicant must meet the following criteria:

- Classification as a current sophomore at Belmont Abbey College
- Preference to residents of Gaston County and underrepresented populations
- BAC cumulative GPA of at least 3.0
- Pursuit of an undergraduate degree in criminal justice
- Demonstration of strong school and community involvement through volunteerism
- Clear Criminal History

Required Information for CURRENT BAC students:

- 1. Completed application
- 2. Unofficial BAC transcript
- 3. Three Letters of Recommendation (two of which must be from a BAC faculty member)
- 4. If selected as a finalist, you will be required to complete additional paperwork for participation in police intern activities including: polygraph waiver, information credit truthfulness, photograph fingerprint consent, and internship packet. You will also participate in an oral interview with the scholarship committee comprised of Gaston County and Belmont Abbey College officials.
- The scholarship recipient will be expected to complete a degree in Criminal Justice from Belmont Abbey College and work for a minimum of five years with the Gaston County Police Department.
